

**Qualifications for Patients of Charitable Pharmacy of Central Ohio, Inc.**

*“We serve residents of Franklin County at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level while complying with all of the contractual obligations of our donors.”*

1. Must live in Franklin County, OH, and have proof of residence, such as a lease or utility bill. *(If no proof of residence, see 2b below for alternate documentation requirements.)*
2. Income at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (see chart below). Patients must bring the following proof of income:
  - a. Current monthly income (this could be the patient’s latest tax return, pay stub, bank statement showing regular deposits, or a letter from Social Services, Ohio Works First [welfare], or SNAP [food stamps] ).
  - b. If unable to provide documentation, patient must bring a letter on official letterhead from another social services provider (such as Jobs & Family Services, or a homeless shelter) attesting to the patient’s identity, residency, date of birth, and lack of income. Patient must then sign ‘Self-Declaration of Income.’
3. No health insurance; or the required prescription co-pay is disproportionate to the patient’s income.
4. Patients may initially be certified for up to 6 months and must be recertified every 6 months.
5. If the patient does not meet the above requirements, he/she may be considered for inclusion in the Charitable Pharmacy on a case-by-case basis, depending on the financial status of the patient.
